# Message from the Pastor



## **Christ and the Nation**

Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD. (Psalm 33:12a)

### Do not put your trust in princes (Ps. 146:3a).

"Christian nationalism" is a phrase that pops up in the news these days. What exactly it means differs, depending on the news source. But generally, Christian nationalism is the idea that our nation was founded as a Christian nation and that church and state should work together to reestablish Christianity as the U.S. official religion and basis of our laws.

On the surface that sounds great. Didn't the psalmist write, "Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord"? And didn't the Declaration of Independence talk about us being "created equal" and refer to God as Creator?

But on closer examination, our nation really wasn't established as a "Christian" nation. Many of our founding fathers held more to deism than the theology of the Bible. (Deism, the teaching that God created the world, then let things go on its own, was in vogue among upper society then.) Thomas Jefferson, for example, even cut sections out of his Bible that his reason didn't agree with (such as Jesus' miracles and the resurrection).

When our country was established, the framers of the constitution made sure that there would be freedom of religion. The First Amendment reads, "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof..." The state will not interfere with our right to worship. But the state is forbidden to "establish" religion. All faiths, not just Christians, enjoy freedom of religion.

Let's imagine that the state legislature or Congress passes legislation making Christianity the official religion, that prayers must be said in school by the teacher, etc. What if the teacher is a Mormon, or a Jew, or a Catholic who includes prayers to Mary? Could we Lutherans join in such a prayer? Or suppose that the government declares that prayers and references to God be a generic "God," no mention of Christ so as not to create offense. That would not give glory to Christ, who says, "He who does not honor the Son does not honor the Father, who sent me" (John 5:25).

Many Christian nationalists mean well. But their ideas are bad for both the state and its citizens. Christians who are intrigued by the idea of Christian nationalism should keep in mind another passage from the Psalms: "Do not put your trust in princes." We have one Leader, and one alone, whom we follow: Christ. And his kingdom "is not of this world," as he said to Pilate (John 18:36). Jesus did not come to make the United States his personal kingdom. Let's be good citizens, but instead of putting our trust in Biden, or Trump, or Evers as our Savior, let's put our trust in Jesus alone.
