# Message from the Pastor



#### **Easter**

After this, Jesus showed himself again to the disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. (John 21:1 EHV)

"Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!"

Everybody knows that Easter Sunday is March 31<sup>st</sup> this year. Stores have advertised it already in February. Calendars have it marked. And churches are full, or at least fuller than usual, when Easter Sunday arrives. Even members who don't come much will show up on Easter.

The Easter season begins March 31<sup>st</sup>, but it doesn't end on that Sunday! The Easter season continues for another six Sundays, this year going to May 12<sup>th</sup>. Just as Jesus continued to appear to his disciples and other believers over a 40-day period, like the time he came in John 21, so Easter is not a "one-and-done" celebration for us Christians. We're eager to come back to church, each Sunday, to be reminded, "Yes, Jesus still lives, our risen Lord!"

Christ's resurrection is worth celebrating all this month of April. As Paul told the Christians in Corinth, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins" (1 Cor. 15:17). If Christ didn't rise, that means his death didn't actually take away our sins, and we wouldn't get to live after death either. "But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1 Cor. 15:20). Because Jesus has been raised, our faith lives, and we can look forward to our own resurrection on the Last Day!

When you come to St. Paul's for Sunday services this month, you'll hear more of what this Easter message means for our daily lives. Here's what to expect when you come:

2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter, April 7: Jesus lives to give us peace—just as he did when he appeared to his disciples, both the first Easter and the following Sunday. Don't doubt; believe! Worship time: 8:30 a.m., with communion.

3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Easter, April 14: Jesus lives to continue his message. The disciples were sent as apostles to proclaim repentance and forgiveness. Jesus lives now to carry out his message through us today. Worship times: 7:30 and 10 a.m.

4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter, April 21: Jesus lives as our Good Shepherd. How much he still cares for us! Listen to his voice and follow him! Worship times: 7:30 and 10 a.m. Communion will be served.

5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter, April 28: Jesus lives as the Vine. We are like branches in a grape vine or tomato plant; thanks to Jesus we also live and can bear fruit—fruits of faith, good works. Worship times: 7:30 and 10 a.m.

#### A Message from your Church Council...

## "You Can Help our MLC Student"

Martin Luther College (MLC) provides valuable ministerial training for our synod. MLC is concerned about the educational debt load MLC graduates have and are now offering a Congregational Partner Grant Program to help students with their tuition cost.

For the 2024-25 academic year, MLC will match up to \$1,450 from a congregation that supports a member attending MLC. St. Paul's has one member, Faith Blauert, attending MLC who is eligible to participate for these matching funds.

St. Paul's Church Council has decided to participate in the Congregational Partner Grant Program by allowing members to make personal gifts to a new budget line item created for the program. We will have a special jar in the fellowship area for gifts; in addition, you can make a separate offering gift and direct it to St. Paul's Congregational Partner Grant Program.

The specific details for St. Pauls' participation:

- MLC will match St. Paul's contribution dollar-for-dollar up to \$1,450 for Faith.
- Congregational grants will be applied to the fall semester and MLC matching funds will be applied to the spring semester. MLC will return congregational funds for any student that withdraws prior to completing 60% of the fall semester.
- St. Paul's must submit the application and funding by July 15, 2024, in order for Faith to receive the matching funds.
- Only undergraduate students that are members of our church during the 2024-25 school year are eligible for the matching funds.

Thank you for being willing to be a part of helping Faith and helping our synod!
