Message from the Pastor



Transfiguration and Lent

After six days Jesus took Peter, James and John with him and led them up a high mountain, where they were all alone. There he was transfigured before them. (Mark 9:2)

As the time approached for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out for Jerusalem. (Luke 9:51)

In the last six months of his life, Jesus went up two mountains. They could not have been any more different from each other. On the first mountain Jesus climbed, his three disciples saw a breath-taking sight. It wasn't the view from the mountain, but what was on that mountain. Jesus was "transfigured before them." That meant his appearance changed; glory was streaming from his face, and his clothes became dazzling white like lightning. The disciples were seeing Jesus in his true colors, as the divine, glorious Son of God.

But it wasn't long afterwards that Jesus "resolutely set out for Jerusalem." It took some time, Jesus still had much to teach, people to heal—but his mind was on another mountain, Mount Calvary ("the place of the skull"). There Jesus would hide any glory and appear as a shamed, disgraced convict to be tortured as he hung dying on a cross. Six months after the transfiguration came the crucifixion and Jesus' death.

As we come to worship Jesus this month, we'll notice the sharp contrast. On February 11th, the last Sunday of Epiphany, we'll observe Jesus' transfiguration and learn what it means for us, how we also can be assured that Jesus is God's

Son. "Listen to him!" as the voice told Peter, James and John (Luke 9:35). The altar cloths that Sunday will be white, to signify Jesus' holiness and divinity.

On Wednesday, February 14, we will start the Lenten season. The altar cloths turn purple, as a time of repentance for us and passion for our Savior. In Lent we too will "resolutely set out for Jerusalem," walking with Jesus in his final two days from the upper room in Jerusalem to his dying breaths on the cross. We learn the great love of Jesus, that he hid his glory and emptied himself of divine privileges so he would be branded a sinner and take the place of us sinners.

Let us go with Jesus to both mountains this Transfiguration and this Lenten season. Let's keep both in mind, for Jesus needed to be true God to win our salvation from sin, but also true man to suffer death for us all.

Sunday, February 4: 5th Sunday of Epiphany. Jesus Is Revealed as Healer. (8:30 am communion)


February 11: Transfiguration Sunday. Jesus Is Revealed as God's Son.





FELLOWSHIP TIME on February 4






Mary Klemm is our Sunshine Lady for St. Paul's. If anyone is sick or needs a card of encouragement, please contact her.

President James Dohner opened the meeting at 8:35 AM. Pastor Blauert said a prayer. Paul Fuller read the minutes from the last meeting. Wayne Vertein made a motion and Mark Shimniok second it to approve the minutes. The agenda was looked over. Jeremy Zimmerman made a motion and Dave Zimmerman second it to approve the agenda.

Pastor's Report: We averaged 42 people per Sunday in the 4th quarter. Lent services will start on Ash Wednesday February 14, 2024. We will again be in rotation with area WELS pastors. Service will be on Wednesday Evenings at 6:30 PM. We will also have a Maundy Thursday and Good Friday service. The time of the latter will be discussed in new business. Easter will be on March 31, 2024. Sunrise service is planned at 7:00 AM with a breakfast afterwards and a 10:00 AM service. Gary Meske and Donna Krayer are visited regularly as shut-ins. Other visits were given to Sandy Bender, Harold Bochler, Delores Raddatz, Ellie Schultz, Faith Vertein, and Linda Favre due to their health issues making it hard for them to attend church. Other members who have not attended church recently but still live in the area have been contacted by Pastor Bauert with some drop-in visits. Those he has not visited yet in the last year will also be contacted to arrange a visit. Aurella Gurgel's funeral was on Saturday January 13, 2024 at St Paul's. Bob Klingenmeyer had a graveside service on Thursday January 11, 2024. Education: We are averaging 7 people for the Bible class Getting into God's Word which will complete by the end of January. We have between 3 to 5 students attending Sunday school. 5 children participated in the children's Christmas eve service on December 24, 2023. There are 2 seventh grade boys in the catechism class that meets on Wednesday afternoon. Carrah Shimniok is taking the Bible information class with the intention of becoming a member. A motion was made by Paul Fuller and second by Jeremy Zimmerman to accept the nomination of Mark Shimniok and Jeremy Zimmerman to the council. The 2024 budget proposal was looked over. Wayne Vertein made a motion and Jeremy Zimmerman second it to approve the proposal. Paul Fuller made a motion and Jeremy Zimmerman second it to continue using the Christian Worship Service Builder. The Good Friday service was requested to be at 3:00 PM on Good Friday and the Easter Sunday sunrise service was recommended to be at 7:00 AM. Also it was recommended to start bringing the offering plates from the back up to the altar during the service. Jeremy Zimmerman made a motion and Paul Fuller second it to approve all 3 recommendations. In old business the kitchen stove burner still needs to be looked at and the parsonage garage door still needs to be replaced. Probably in the spring. Paul Fuller made a motion and Jeremy Zimmerman second it to close the meeting at 9:17 AM. Pastor Blauert lead the congregation in singing hymn 928 "May the grace of Christ our savior" to close as a blessing.
