A Life-long Competition

Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. (1 Corinthians 9:24)

Are you watching the Olympics this summer? Many of us enjoy watching the competitions. Who will be fastest runner, the strongest weight-lifter and the most athletic gymnast? Which nations will win the basketball, volleyball and soccer championships? Which nation will take home the most gold medals? So many nations and athletes involved make this competition more interesting to watch.

The apostle Paul compared the Christian life to a race. The Corinthians in Greece were acquainted with Olympic competitions back then, though the athletes didn't hail from all over the world. But they, and we today, can easily grasp what Paul is telling us. We need to compete in such a way as to "get the prize."

Olympic athletes must endure hard training to get where they're at. The Christian life is one of strict training for us too. We are constantly battling our sinful nature and the temptations from the devil and this sinful world. The Lord may decide to place a cross on us to carry throughout life, a hardship meant to help us focus on Christ. Training this way is not easy, but helps our Christian life.

The Christian competition is like a race in that each one must compete. We cannot stay on the sidelines and say, "My mom or my spouse is a faithful church-goer, that should count." Each one needs to live their faith and not coast through life on someone else's coattails.

At the same time, the Christian's competition is more like a team sport than an individual sport. We're joined with like-minded Christians in worshiping together, studying God's Word at church and at home, and supporting missions across the world. We're not competing against each other, but helping each other to be able to cross the finish line.

Paul's words, "only one gets the prize," may sound discouraging. We might be concerned that we'll miss out on the prize of heaven when we stumble and fall into sin, when we strike out against Satan or fail to hit the bullseye of God's commands. But we have one who ran the race for us already and won the prize. Jesus said on the cross, "It is finished!" He lived perfectly without any sin, and knocked out Satan in his match with him on the cross. When Jesus rose from the grave and ascended to heaven, it was like God giving him the gold medal.

When we run to get the prize, we run with confidence, knowing that our Lord has already gained the victory for us. And we know what the prize is: Eternal life in heaven! This is a prize given to us by grace, a treasure that "will neither spoil or fade, kept in heaven for you" (1 Peter 1:4). Keeping running the good race!
